Santa's Village Visit

I have had notification from the North Pole that Santa can once again visit our village on Christmas Eve, delivering presents to young and old, with 2 legs or 4. Please get your requests in as early as you can, Santa's time is very limited and with around 170 gifts to gather and wrap it is quite a task.

Before I finish, I would like to leave you with this simple Halloween treat to try:

Sausage Mummies

Ingredients

- 1 pack chipolata sausages
- 1 pack ready-rolled puff pastry
- 1 egg, beaten (for egg wash)
- Ketchup for dipping

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180c (160c Fan)
2. Unroll puff pastry and cut into thin strips about 1cm wide.
3. Take a sausage and wrap a strip of pastry around it, leaving a gap for the face.
4. Place the wrapped sausages on a baking tray lined with parchment paper.
5. Brush the pastry with the beaten egg.
6. Bake for 12-15mins, or until the pastry is golden and puffed up.
7. Once the mummies are cooked and slightly cooled, use a toothpick to dab on 2 small dots of ketchup to create the eyes.
8. Serve warm with a pot of "bloody" ketchup for dipping

PARISH COUNCIL

We hope everyone has had a safe and happy summer, and enjoyed the (mostly) good weather. During our summer break our Ranger Nick has still been busy with regular routine jobs as well as carrying out the refurbishment of the post which supports the village sign, refurbishing a bench on Thistledown, installing bird-deterrent spikes on the play equipment and attending to holes in the field on John Barr Playing Field.

In July we held our first Community Safety Meeting, which was attended by three Councillors, PC James Draper, Sgt Kevin Mayle and 21 residents including three members of Panfield Community Association and our Speed Watch co-ordinator Paul Summers.

The report from the Police outlined Government investment in more police constables, six for the Braintree District, five of whom will stay in the Braintree area. It is hoped to establish a named officer and a PSCO for Panfield in the near future.

Crime in the Panfield ward is very low: the incidents this year are 40% down on the 2024 total of 76 incidents. Drug crime is slightly higher than the previous year, but the Police are catching more dealers and drivers under the influence of substances. Last year three vehicle thefts were reported in Panfield; overall it is felt that the district is a safe place and that people report crimes to the police.

It was emphasised that it is very worthwhile for everyone to use property markers for their possessions, for example bikes, phones, laptops, and to also buy Faraday bags for cards and car keys; it is especially important to lock your car when not in use, and to not keep valuables in bedside cabinets or top drawers as that is the first place thieves will look.

There was a reminder that Police cannot go into any property to recover stolen goods without a warrant, and that there is a website where people can upload photos and serial numbers of items to secure their identification should they be stolen. Free property markers were given to everyone attending the meeting.

Questions were asked by a resident about the discovery of nitrous oxide canisters along Hall Road. The advice was to obtain number plate details if possible and to inform the police using the 'What3Words' for location. Everyone was urged not to approach any suspicious dealings, and, if feeling unsafe, to contact the Police.

A question was also raised about unlicensed peddlers (or "Nottingham Knockers" as they are often called) knocking on residents' doors to sell items or offer services. It was confirmed that no one has a licence to peddle in Essex as a whole; if possible residents should obtain the vehicle registration number and report the incident to the Police.

Residents who have CCTV or Ring doorbells were asked if they were happy to register their details with our Clerk in order to produce an outline of where camera footage could be used when incidents occur. Everyone agreed that it was a very successful and helpful meeting.

During the summer there was an attempt to gain access to Thistledown Playing Field which was fortunately foiled by the bollards which have now been reinforced. We are extremely grateful to the two residents who assisted in repairing the damage caused by this incident, and by their use of a cherry-picker to block further attempts at access before extra security measures could be installed. Many thanks to our vigilant and resourceful residents!

If you would like to join our team of Councillors, we have a vacancy. No previous experience is needed as all necessary training will be given; the most important factor is your enthusiasm for and dedication to the protection of Panfield Village and its residents and the enhancement of Panfield's assets and lovely rural location for present and future generations. Dear Friends,

Over the Summer we had the chance to spend a few days in the Scottish Borders. Plenty of wonderful places to visit and even the weather held. It would have been a very different trip though without the Satnav! So often it was accurate, but occasionally we ended up totally lost!

On one occasion, the satnav proudly said, 'you have arrived'. Had we? Well, I could see the Abbey ruins we were trying to visit but they were the other side of an 8ft fence with no access from where we were. At one point we did consider parking and scaling the fence, but after performing a u turn, and with a little patience, and persistence, we did get there in the end.

I would like to say it was the first time the satnav got me lost but it wasn't, and I am sure it will happen again. It struck me that the satnav getting me lost is a good metaphor for life as well. Is life always plain sailing? Do we always know the way? No, we lose our way at times, get ourselves in a muddle. The decisions we take can leave us going off from the pre-planned route, outside factors affect us too, and we do get lost. We get confused, overwhelmed and wonder how will this situation play out, what do I do next?

When we are lost, when life is utterly confusing, performing a u turn could be a good first start. However, often we don't. Instead, we crash on, hoping it will sort itself, and then often end up even more lost. That being lost, that sadness can sit with us and have a profound impact upon us. They creep up on us as unsuspecting passengers. At its worst it then goes on to affect who we are. It is then we can go from feeling lost, to feeling broken.

October 10th is World Mental Health Day, raising awareness of the challenges that we all face. Awareness is the key, taking away the stigma that often comes with mental health. When we break a bone, or have something wrong, we do something about it. Our physical health is a priority. With our mental health, for some reason we just keep on going. Rarely do we step back, rarely do we ask for help. Somehow, we just try to manage, covering up the scars.

'Kintsugi' is a Japanese art, and a beautiful way of putting back together what is broken. In Japan, when a bowl or vase breaks before glueing it back together, they add gold to that glue. It means the scars; the brokenness is not hidden away but valued and seen as precious. They are reminders of who we really are, brokenness and all. A honest way to see ourselves too.

I hope that we each will take some time to consider our mental health and those of friends and family around us. It needs to be far more of a priority that we often make it. Especially when we realise there is no one satnav for life that is certain to get us there without fail. We will get lost at times, but we are not alone, we need to be there for one another too, remembering as we do so that like that precious art of Kintsugi, we are precious too, especially with the scars that life has brought.

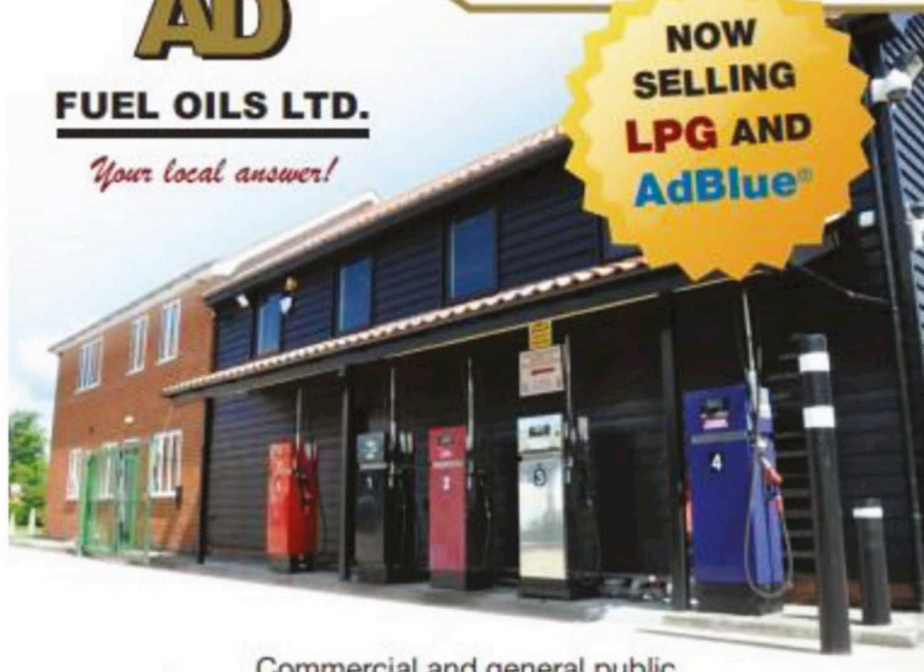

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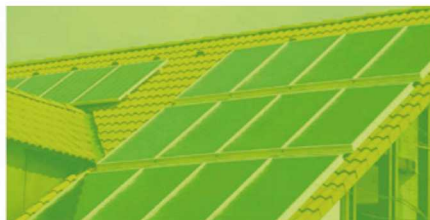
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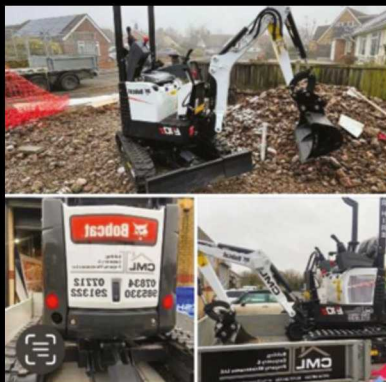
